Chris was a founder member of the Friends, attending all our meetings even though she did not live in Meads. She clearly loved our parks and was one of our most loyal supporters. But what Chris will be remembered for most of all will be the exquisite cakes that she made for our cake sales over the years. They were mini works of art and although we would often remind her, she never once claimed a penny in expenses. She also always baked a couple of her legendary Victoria sponge cakes to be sold in support of the Eastbourne Operatic and Dramatic Society's Shakespeare productions in the Italian Gardens.

## Formation of a new community group – Friends Together

It came as no surprise to the Committee that other friends of parks groups are experiencing similar problems with the Council's main contractor *Id*Verde and when our Chair Terrie Rintoul received an invitation from Gaynor Sedgewick, Chair of the Friends of Eastbourne Seafront to come to a meeting to be held on 17 June she immediately accepted. Also attending were representatives from the friends groups of Hampden Park, Motcombe Gardens, Manor Gardens & Gildredge Park and Ocklynge Cemetery resulting in the formation of Friends Together.

A follow up meeting was held on 22 July when the group, now including the Friends of Princes Park, was joined by Councillors Christina Ewbank and Colin Swansborough, together with Lee Banner, Assistant Director – Neighbourhood and Transformation at Lewes and Eastbourne Borough Councils.

The meeting went extremely well. We brought the point home that we are all keen to help and can be relied upon. The next stage, at Lee Banner's suggestion, will be the running of a workshop style session to formulate an action plan.

#### Good news

Our application to the John Jackson Charitable Trust for a grant towards the cost of the replacement sign in the Peace Garden has been successful. We are extremely grateful to the trust for the award of  $\pounds$ 500 which means that we can now go ahead and place the order with Rivermeade. We are hoping that the sign will be installed in the Autumn.

## **Community Payback**

Walking through the Italian Gardens you may have noticed that both the back of the stage structure and the benches have been painted. This work has been carried out by Community Payback, the organisation that supervises people doing community service in place of serving prison sentences. They have gone on to paint the metal railings in the Peace Garden which were in a sorry state and have done a good job. It is hoped that we can call on their help again in the future. We are grateful to Gary Batchelor and Maxine Saunders of Neighbourhood First for organising this.
